FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Who is eligible for the Scholars Programme?

The programme is targeted at our highest-achieving A Level students. Typically, we look for students with a strong profile of GCSE grades (7 - 9) who demonstrate a passion for academic inquiry and a desire to progress to highly competitive universities or apprenticeships.

Is it only for students wanting to go to Oxford or Cambridge?

No. While we provide specialised support for Oxbridge applicants, the programme is equally beneficial for those targeting any Russell Group university or prestigious Higher/Degree Apprenticeships with major global firms.

What is the time commitment?

The programme is designed to complement, not overwhelm, your A Level studies. It includes regular scheduled seminars, workshops and guest speaker events. Some independent research and 'super-curricular' reading are expected to help you develop the depth of knowledge required for top-tier applications.

How does this help my university application?

Universities look for 'super-curricular' engagement - evidence that you have explored your subject beyond the classroom. The Scholars Programme provides you with the opportunities and the vocabulary to demonstrate this engagement in your personal statement and during interviews.

Will I receive help with admissions tests?

Yes. For courses that require entrance exams (such as Law, Medicine, or Oxbridge-specific tests), we provide guidance on preparation and signpost you to high-quality resources and practice materials.
